Due to separation from owner or new environment) or travelling. Also helps with unwanted or unruly behaviour (chewing furniture for instance). Suitable to give to pets before grooming.

▶ What is Omega Aid?

A nutritional supplement to aid in the management of various skin conditions in cats and dogs. OmegaAid is designed to significantly increase the Omega 3 fatty acid intake

▶ What's in Omega Aid?

Ingredients (per 10ml)

Omega 3 (65% EPA+DHA)	1000mg
Omega 6	2000mg*
Vitamin A – Antioxidant	2666iu
Vitamin D – Antioxidant	666iu
Vitamin E – Antioxidant	27iu

▶ How does Omega Aid work?

- OmegaAid works by correcting any dietary fatty acid imbalances ensuring the supply of the correct nutrients to maintain a healthy skin and coat.
- OmegaAid provides a supplemental source of Omega 3 and Omega 6 fatty acids plus vitamins A, D and E, which are beneficial for the maintenance of healthy looking skin and coats in cats and dogs.
- Essential fatty acids, called Omega 3 and Omega 6 fatty acids are needed by the body, just like vitamins. However, as the body cannot manufacture them they must be supplied by the diet. Fatty acids are major components of membranes such as skin, fur, nails and hair. The health of the skin and coat therefore depends on the type and properties of fatty acid available to them.

▶ What does Omega Aid look like?

- Omega Aid is presented as an aniseed flavoured oil in a 250ml bottle with a measuring pump top.



▶ Frequently Asked Questions

Q. For how long should I use Omega Aid?

A. Use Omega Aid for at least 1 month.

Q. How soon should an effect be seen?

A. As Omega Aid is working to make changes to the skin and coat it can take up to 30 days as new fur grows to see the affect.

Q. Can Omega Aid be given with other feeds or supplements?

A. Yes. Omega Aid can be given in addition to any other supplements.

Q. Can I give Omega Aid to my cat?

A. Yes. Omega Aid is effective for cats. Simply give the amount according to your pets' weight as shown on the bottle.

Q. How long does a bottle last?

A. Omega Aid 250ml will last 1 month for a 10kg animal. The product has a shelf-life of 2 years

Q. How do I give Omega Aid to my pet?

A. Omega Aid can be poured over food as required. Use the handy measuring pump on the top of the bottle for ease of use.

Feeding Recommendations

Weight (cats/dogs)	Daily Amount
0-5kg (0-11lb)	2.5ml (1 Pump)
5-10kg (11-22 lb)	5ml (2 Pumps)
10-20kg (22-44 lb)	7.5ml (3 pumps)
20-30kg (44-66 lb)	10ml (4 pumps)
>30kg	12.5 - 15ml daily (5/6 Pumps)

After 4 weeks decrease daily intake by half. Consult your vet to adjust the intake to your pet's specific needs.

Q. Why doesn't a dog get enough of these essential fatty acids in its diet?

A. Many diets, even prepared foods, are low in particular fats (Omega 3 fatty acids). By giving Omega Aid the balance of fats is corrected and the correct quality of fat will ensure a healthy skin and coat

Q. Some Pet foods already contain additives of Omega oils – Why do I need to give a supplement?

A. The amounts of Omega fatty acid additives contained in popular pet foods are not sufficient to correct imbalances as they are only intended to meet ongoing requirements. Omega Aid is a specialist supplement to deal with specific skin and coat conditioning issues.
